

Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners:

The Greek word for "church" is ekklesia, which has roots that mean "those who have been called." We, the Church, have been summoned to Christ, called to this place, invited into this special relationship. Today's readings remind us that this call asks something of us. In fact, it asks everything of us. Like Peter, we, too, must respond to Jesus' question: But who do you say that I am? Like Paul, we will be asked to pour ourselves like a libation for those whom we have been called to love. We are asked to compete well, [finish] the race, and the [keep] the faith. We may be called to have courage like Saint Peter in our first reading. The God who worked mighty deeds for Saints Peter and Paul speaks to us in the Liturgy of the Word and gives himself to us in the Eucharist. Of whom or what, should we be afraid, with our Lord so near? We have been called and will be sent having encountered him in this Mass. Saints Peter and Paul, pray for us!



Mensaje del parroco

Estimados feligreses:

La palabra griega para "iglesia" es ekklesia, cuya raíz significa "aquellos que han sido llamados". Nosotros, la Iglesia, hemos sido convocados a Cristo, llamados a este lugar, invitados a esta relación especial. Las lecturas de hoy nos recuerdan que este llamado nos exige algo. De hecho, nos lo exige todo. Como Pedro, también nosotros debemos responder a la pregunta de Jesús: "¿Y ustedes quién dicen que soy yo?". Como Pablo, se nos pedirá que nos entreguemos como una libación por aquellos a quienes hemos sido llamados a amar. Se nos pide que compitamos bien, [terminar] la carrera y [mantener] la fe. Podemos ser llamados a tener la valentía de San Pedro en nuestra primera lectura. El Dios que obró obras poderosas por los santos Pedro y Pablo nos habla en la Liturgia de la Palabra y se nos entrega en la Eucaristía. ¿De quién o de qué debemos temer, estando nuestro Señor tan cerca? Hemos sido llamados y seremos enviados tras haberlo encontrado en esta Misa. ¡Santos Pedro y Pablo, rueguen por nosotros!

Scripture Readings

First Reading: In those days, King Herod laid hands upon some members of the Church to harm them. He had James, the brother of John, killed by the sword, and when he saw that this was pleasing to the Jews he proceeded to arrest Peter also. —It was the feast of Unleavened Bread.— He had him taken into custody and put in prison under the guard of four squads of four soldiers each. He intended to bring him before the people after Passover. Peter thus was being kept in prison, but prayer by the Church was fervently being made to God on his behalf. On the very night before Herod was to bring him to trial, Peter, secured by double chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while outside the door guards kept watch on the prison. Suddenly the angel of the Lord stood by him and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and awakened him, saying, “Get up quickly.” The chains fell from his wrists. The angel said to him, “Put on your belt and your sandals.” He did so. Then he said to him, “Put on your cloak and follow me.” So he followed him out, not realizing that what was happening through the angel was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. They passed the first guard, then the second, and came to the iron gate leading out to the city, which opened for them by itself. They emerged and made their way down an alley, and suddenly the angel left him. Then Peter recovered his senses and said, “Now I know for certain that the Lord sent his angel and rescued me from the hand of Herod and from all that the Jewish people had been expecting.” ([Acts 12:1-11](#))

Psalm: The angel of the Lord will rescue those who fear him.

Second: I, Paul, am already being poured out like a libation, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith. From now on the crown of righteousness awaits me, which the Lord, the just judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me, but to all who have longed for his appearance. The Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the proclamation might be completed and all the Gentiles might hear it. And I was rescued from the lion’s mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil threat and will bring me safe to his heavenly Kingdom. To him be glory forever and ever. Amen. ([2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18](#))

Gospel: When Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi he asked his disciples, “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” They replied, “Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.” He said to them, “But who do you say that I am?” Simon Peter said in reply, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” Jesus said to him in reply, “Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the Kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.” ([Matthew 16:13-19](#))
