Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners:

When we speak of God, we automatically tend to use images and ideas from our own human and limited experiences, but these will never fully express what we are trying to say. The finite human imagination cannot grasp the infinite God. Yet there is a central foundation of our faith for which we do not have to "imagine" some image or think of a metaphor, and that is the core belief that through Jesus Christ we have been offered redemption. He is the one who has made peace by the blood of his cross, and by his proclamation of the kingdom he has shown us the way to live in a manner worthy of eternal life. The question about eternal life posed by the scholar of the law in today's Gospel is "the question." Jesus' answer to him, told in the familiar parable of the Good Samaritan, is a central message of the Gospel: love one another as Christ has love us. As redemption is found only in Christ, our challenge is to live according to his commands and to love the Lord as a lifetime response to his offer of life. To hear, understand, and go and do likewise.

Mensaje del parroco

Estimados feligreses:

Cuando hablamos de Dios, automáticamente tendemos a usar imágenes e ideas de nuestras propias y limitadas experiencias humanas, pero estas nunca expresarán plenamente lo que intentamos decir. La imaginación humana finita no puede comprender al Dios infinito. Sin embargo, existe un fundamento central de nuestra fe, para el cual no tenemos que "imaginar" ninguna imagen ni pensar en una metáfora, y es la creencia fundamental de que a través de Jesucristo se nos ha ofrecido la redención. Él es quien hizo la paz mediante la sangre de su cruz, y mediante su proclamación del reino nos ha mostrado el camino para vivir de una manera digna de la vida eterna. La pregunta sobre la vida eterna que plantea el doctor de la ley en el Evangelio de hoy es «la pregunta». La respuesta de Jesús, narrada en la conocida parábola del Buen Samaritano, es un mensaje central del Evangelio: amarnos los unos a los otros como Cristo nos ha amado. Como la redención solo se encuentra en Cristo, nuestro reto es vivir según sus mandamientos y amar al Señor como respuesta vital a su ofrecimiento de vida. Escuchar, comprender, ir y hacer lo mismo.

Scripture Readings

First Reading: Moses said to the people: "If only you would heed the voice of the LORD, your God, and keep his commandments and statutes that are written in this book of the law, when you return to the LORD, your God, with all your heart and all your soul. "For this command that I enjoin on you today is not too mysterious and remote for you. It is not up in the sky, that you should say, 'Who will go up in the sky to get it for us and tell us of it, that we may carry it out?' Nor is it across the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross the sea to get it for us and tell us of it, that we may carry it out?' No, it is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out." (Deuteronomy 30:10-14)

Psalm: Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live. (Psalm 69:14, 17, 30-31, 33-34, 36, 37)

Second: Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things he himself might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him, making peace by the blood of his cross through him, whether those on earth or those in heaven. (Colossians 1:15-20)

Gospel: There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test Jesus and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He said in reply, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live." But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. They stripped and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead. A priest happened to be going down that road, but when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. Likewise a Levite came to the place, and when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper with the instruction, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.' Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."(Luke 10:25-37)

Faith Formation Registration

Registration for the 2025-26 school year will be held after all Masses the weekends of August 23 & 24, August 30 & 31 and the final day to register your student is on Sunday, September 7. No new students will be accepted after September 7th!!!!!!

Please come by the Parish Hall and get your children registered. Classes are available for ages 5 years through 18 years.

Cost is \$60 per student and \$35 fee for the final year of preparation for 1st Communion and for the final year of preparation for Confirmation.

Classes will begin on Sunday, October 5th. Class times will be 9:15am-10:30am, 11:15am—12:30pm and 1:15pm—2:30pm for grades K –5th. Classes for 6th and 7th grades will be from 3:15-4:30pm. The class for 8th grade, Confirmation final year will be 9:15pm-11:15pm.
